# Senate Study Committee on Preservation of Georgia's Farmlands

On **July 30**, Brad Vaughan, Legislative Director and Counsel, attended the first meeting of the Senate Study Committee on Preserving Georgia's Farmlands in Statesboro, Georgia.

Brad joined Senator Billy Hickman (R-Statesboro), who serves as the Chairman, and other members of the committee to discuss the current status of Georgia's farmlands and potential policies to protect and sustain the state's valuable agricultural lands.

The Senate Study Committee on the Preservation of Georgia's Farmlands was created by the passage of **Senate Resolution 470**. The following Senators will serve on the seven-member committee:

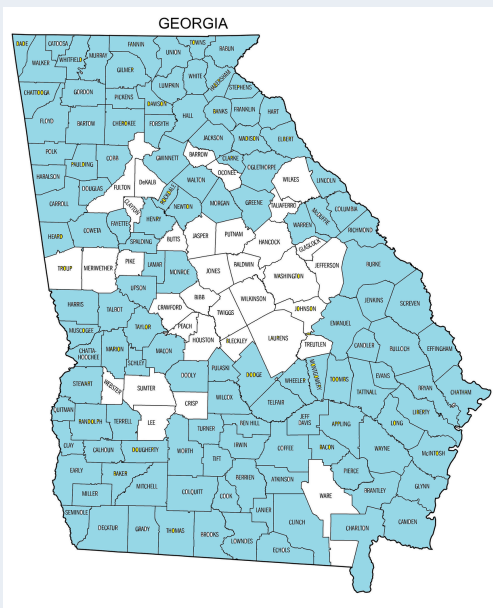
