Georgia Promise Scholarship Update

The Georgia Promise Scholarship student application window for the 2025/2026 academic year is open through September 30, 2025. The next application period will be from December 1 through December 31, 2025. Senate Bill 233 was signed into law in 2024, creating the Georgia Promise Scholarship Program. Senate Bill 233 was a priority for Lt. Governor Burt Jones during the 2024 session. Lt. Governor Jones issued the following statement in support of this legislation being signed into law:


"As a longtime proponent of school choice, I am proud of the General Assembly for passing the most substantive initiative in decades. I want to thank Governor Kemp for his support for school choice and education freedom within our state. Today's signing of SB 233 is a great step in the right direction; however, there is still more work to be done to give parents the choice and resources that can meet their child's unique educational needs. I look forward to working with Governor Kemp and my colleagues in the General Assembly to ensure educational freedom in Georgia."

The Georgia Promise Scholarship empowers families to pursue educational programs that best fit their child's educational needs. The Georgia Promise Scholarship allows Georgia families to use **\$6,500 per eligible student** for private school tuition, tutoring from a Professional Standards Commission certified educator, services from a physician or licensed therapist for occupational, behavioral, physical, or speech-language therapies, textbooks, and supplemental materials such as workbooks and STEM kits. As of September 23, 2025, over 17,000 families applied for the Georgia Promise Scholarship.

How to Apply:

- Families may apply for the Georgia Promise Scholarship at mygeorgiapromise.org.
- The December student application windows will be from December 1-31, 2025 for the Spring 2026 semester.
- Parents should be prepared to provide a state-issued ID, proof of residency, the most recent federal 1040 tax form, and (unless a rising kindergarten student) proof of public-school enrollment for the 2024 2025 academic year (e.g., report card, transcript, enrollment/attendance report).
