Virtual critical care offers an innovative way of providing a second layer of care for patients in the intensive care unit (ICU). Critical care physician experts (also known as intensivists) and experienced critical care nurses work in partnership with physicians and nurses at the patient's bedside by providing round-the-clock monitoring from an off-site location and rapid treatment and intervention at a moment's notice. eICU service adds another layer of support to the care team in the hospital, by providing constant monitoring by qualified remote intensivist physicians and nurses who are alerted to every aspect of a patient's condition at times when other physicians are not able to be at the bedside.
